

The Essential and Important objectives, which are aligned to the WESTEST, <u>must</u> be learned by the student in order to ensure his/her success. Therefore, the majority of instructional time (90% - 95%) must be devoted to the mastery of these objectives. To assist you with your instructional planning, the *Prioritized Curriculum* is divided into learning units (Content Maps) creating an instructional sequence and estimated time for delivering the intended/learned curriculum.
